

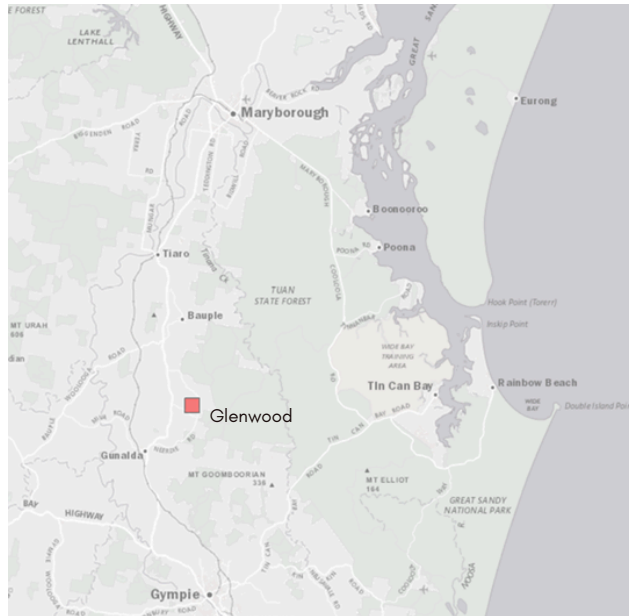

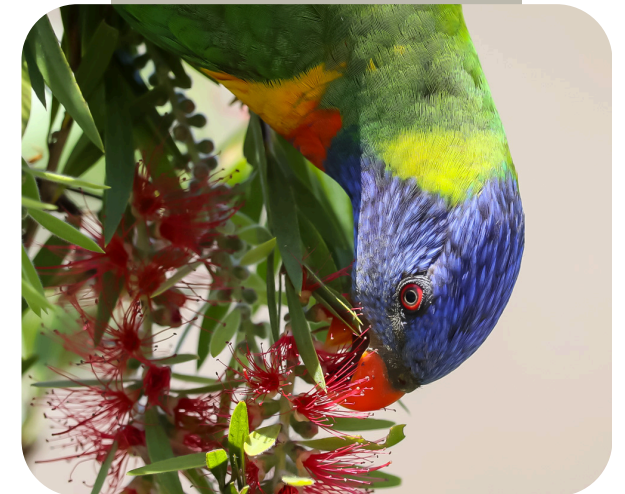

*Rainforest, Wet Sclerophyll forests, lowland eucalypt forests, woodlands, grassy understorey and access to water courses. (Glossy Black-cockatoo live in mainly woodlands dominated by Allocasuarina)*

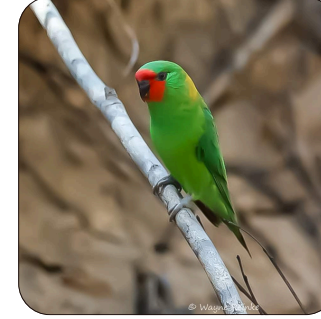
