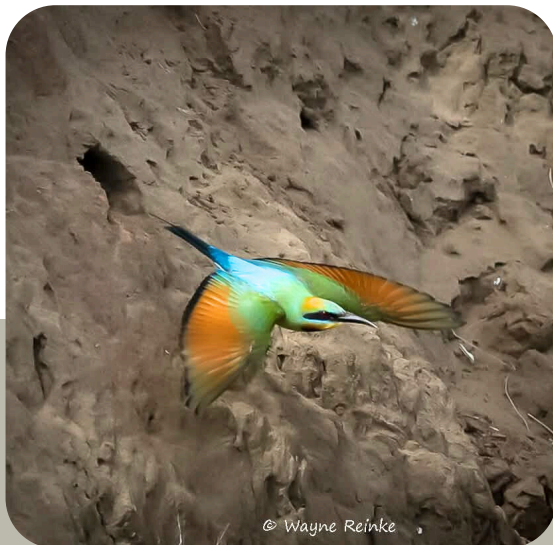

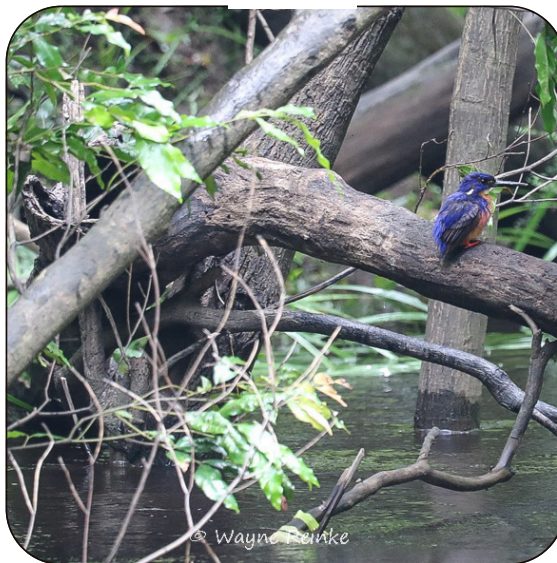

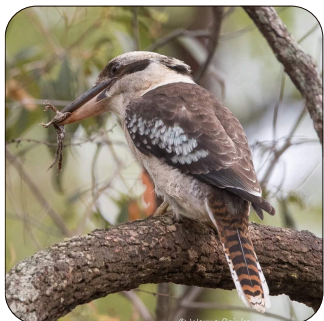

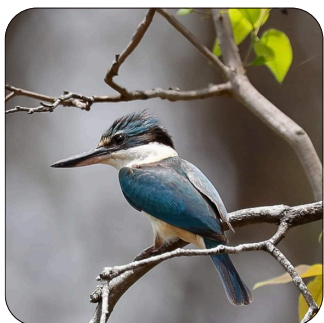

*Most Owls rely on Tree hollows or dense trees for nesting. Eucalypt forest, woodlands.*

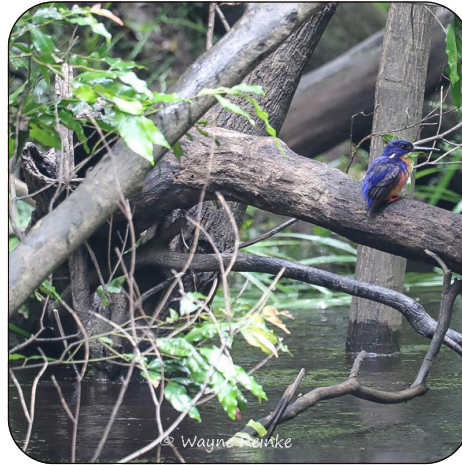

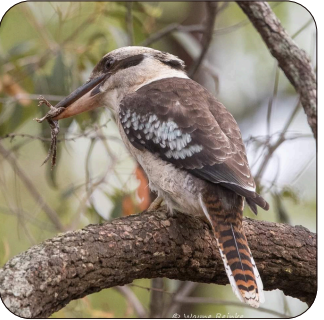

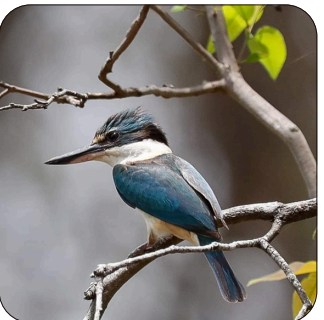
