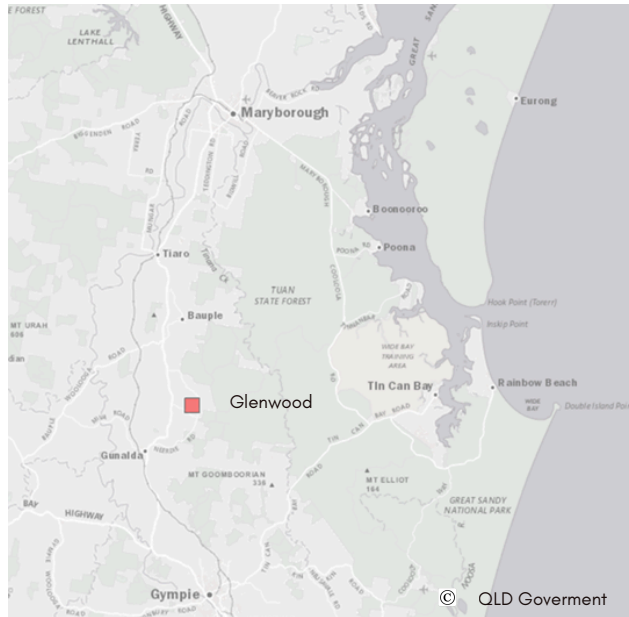


Water Birds – do not stay far from permanent water bodies. Waterways with aquatic plants and riparian vegetation provides food, shelter and nests.

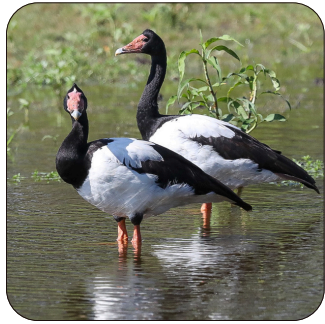
